Trained Medication Aide (TMA):

The Trained Medication Aide reviews concepts and skills learned in the Nursing Assistant course and provide an overview of the requirements concerning medications and their administration. Other study areas include: legalities associated with medication; medical abbreviations and measures; use of the PDR (Physician’s Desk Reference); body systems; and classifications of drugs. Administration of medication via different routes is also covered. Students are required to attend all hours of class.

Acute Care:

This course reviews the concepts and skills learned in the Nursing Assistant course, introduces advanced academic knowledge and concepts, and teaches additional Acute Care skills required for patient care in various departments within a hospital setting. Upon successful completion of four weeks of classroom instruction, the student will participate in one week of supervised clinical experience within several departments of a local hospital. Acute Care Nursing Assistant curriculum is formulated to Minnesota Health Care Core Skills, the Minnesota Academic Standards, and National Health Care Skill Standards.

Health Occupations:

The six and nine month program prepares students for the skills necessary to work as a nursing assistant and/or as a home health aide. Students are prepared for work in long-term care, assisted-living, and home health care settings. Course requirements include Nursing Assistant, Home Health Aide, First Aid/CPR, Trained Medication Aide, and introduction to Health Occupations. In addition students will take additional courses to enhance job performance such as medical terminology, introduction to computers, keyboarding, business communication, human relations, or office procedures. Students enrolling in these courses may be eligible for financial aid. Quarter starts for the Health Occupations programs are as follows:

Spring Quarter - March 7, 2011 through May 27, 2011
Summer Quarter - May 31, 2011 through August 19, 2011
Fall Quarter - September 6, 2011 through November 23, 2011
Winter Quarter - November 28, 2011 through March 2, 2012
